Torah Portion

Deuteronomy 4:37-38 (TLV)

37 Because He loved your fathers, He chose their descendants after them. Then He brought you out from Egypt with His presence, by His great power—
 38 to drive out from before you nations greater and mightier than you, to bring you in to give you their land for an inheritance, as it is this day.

Service Portion

Exodus 7:3-5 (NKJV)

³ And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply My signs and My wonders in the land of Egypt.

⁴ But Pharaoh will not heed you, so that I may lay My hand on Egypt and bring My armies and My people, the children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments.

⁵ And the Egyptians shall know that I *am* the L-RD, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the children of Israel from among them."

Joshua 5:13-15 (NKJV)

¹³ And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted his eyes and looked, and behold, a Man stood opposite him with His sword drawn in His hand. And Joshua went to Him and said to Him, "Are You for us or for our adversaries?"

¹⁴ So He said, "No, but as Commander of the army of the L-RD I have now come."

And Joshua fell on his face to the earth and worshiped, and said to Him, "What does my L-rd say to His servant?"

¹⁵ Then the Commander of the L-RD's army said to Joshua, "Take your sandal off your foot, for the place where you stand *is* holy." And Joshua did so.

Exodus 3:5-8 (NKJV)

⁵ Then He said, "Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand *is* holy ground."

⁶ Moreover He said, "I *am* the G-d of your father—the G-d of Abraham, the G-d of Isaac, and the G-d of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look upon G-d.

⁷ And the L-RD said: "I have surely seen the oppression of My people who *are* in Egypt, and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters, for I know their sorrows.

⁸ So I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up from that land to a good and large land, to a land flowing with milk and honey.

1. Joshua recognized his testimony.

Joshua 4:19 (NKJV)

Now the people came up from the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month.

Exodus 12:1-3 (NKJV)

¹ Now the L-RD spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,

² “This month *shall be* your beginning of months; *it shall be* the first month of the year to you.

³ Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying: ‘On the tenth of this month every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of *his* father, a lamb for a household.

Deuteronomy 4:37-38 (TLV)

37 ... He brought you out from Egypt ...

38 ... to bring you in.

2. Examine your covenant with G-d.

Joshua 5 (NKJV)

² At that time the L-RD said to Joshua, “Make flint knives for yourself, and circumcise the sons of Israel again the second time.”

⁴ And this *is* the reason why Joshua circumcised them: All the people who came out of Egypt *who were* males, all the men of war, had died in the wilderness on the way, after they had come out of Egypt.

⁵ For all the people who came out had been circumcised, but all the people born in the wilderness, on the way as they came out of Egypt, had not been circumcised.

⁹ Then the L-RD said to Joshua, “This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you.”

¹⁰ Now the children of Israel camped in Gilgal, and kept the Passover on the fourteenth day of the month at twilight on the plains of Jericho.

¹¹ And they ate of the produce of the land on the day after the Passover, unleavened bread and parched grain, on the very same day.

Psalms 100:1-4 (NKJV)

¹ Make a joyful shout to the L-RD, all you lands!

² Serve the L-RD with gladness;
Come before His presence with singing.

³ Know that the L-RD, He *is* G-d;
It is He *who* has made us, and not we ourselves;
We are His people and the sheep of His pasture.

⁴ Enter into His gates with thanksgiving,
And into His courts with praise.

Be thankful to Him, *and* bless His name.

Joshua 6 (NKJV)

¹ Now Jericho was securely shut up because of the children of Israel; none went out, and none came in.

² And the L-RD said to Joshua: "See! I have given Jericho into your hand, its king, *and* the mighty men of valor.

³ You shall march around the city, all *you* men of war; you shall go all around the city once. This you shall do six days.

⁴ And seven priests shall bear seven trumpets of rams' horns before the ark. But the seventh day you shall march around the city seven times, and the priests shall blow the trumpets.

⁵ It shall come to pass, when they make a long *blast* with the ram's horn, *and* when you hear the sound of the trumpet, that all the people shall shout with a great shout; then the wall of the city will fall down flat. And the people shall go up every man straight before him."
