Key Scriptures: Daniel 7:13–14; Revelation 19:11–16

Discuss

1. In the story of Joseph in the Bible, his family rejects him but he later becomes ruler over Egypt. How does Joseph's life parallel Jesus' life?
2. Read Joshua 5:13–15. Why do you think Jesus revealed Himself as the warrior King?
3. Can you think of a time when you experienced Jesus fighting for you as your warrior King? What happened?
4. Read 2 Kings 6:16–17. Why did the servant need his eyes opened?
5. How does God open our eyes like He opened the servant's eyes?
6. Pastor Josh said a meek person is one who has a sword but keeps it in its sheath. What does this look like in our everyday lives?
7. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?

- God is the Ancient of Days.
- Jesus is the Messiah.
- Jesus is our warrior King.
