### Review

### Discuss

3. What do you think is the role of a mentor?

5. How have you benefited from an older mentor in your life?
6. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit if there is someone who could mentor you or speak into your life. Does someone come to mind?
7. Can you think of one or two younger people God has put in your life for you to mentor? What could happen if you made your time with them more intentional?
8. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?
